DIRECT DEBIT GUARANTEE

- This Guarantee is offered by all banks and building societies that accept instructions to pay Direct Debits
- If there are any changes to the amount, date or frequency of your Direct Debit University of Oxford will notify you 10 working days in advance of your account being debited or as otherwise agreed. If you request University of Oxford to collect a payment,
- confirmation of the amount and date will be given to you at the time of the request.
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit, by University of Oxford or your bank or building society, you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society
- If you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when University of Oxford asks you to
- You can cancel a Direct Debit at any time by simply contacting your bank or building society. Written confirmation may be required. Please also notify us.

HOW WE USE YOUR DATA

The Bodleian Libraries is part of the University of Oxford. The personal data you provide on this form will be used by the University of Oxford to fulfil our contractual obligations to you to service your membership, and to meet our legitimate interest of alumni and supporter engagement, fundraising and stewardship. We will use your data to: send renewal information. Friends of the Bodleian newsletters. What's On leaflets and Friends of the Bodleian flyers or invitations for events you are entitled to attend; to record information about your membership, including any gift agreements, donations, or relevant correspondence; communicate with you about the impact of your membership and donation appeals that may be of interest to you; to invite you to support the work of the Bodleian Libraries by volunteering or getting involved in fundraising activities; to update your contact details and communication preferences; to claim gift aid (where applicable); and to record information about your willingness and capacity to support our charitable objectives.

If you buy membership as a gift, your details and your association with that membership will be recorded. All our communications with you will be by post, unless you give us permission to contact you by email. You give us this permission by providing your email address on this form.

WHO HAS ACCESS TO YOUR DATA?

The data you provide will be stored in the University's relationship management system, shared across the collegiate University of Oxford, including with its relevant clubs and societies if appropriate, in accordance with the University's policies and procedures via our shared relationship management system. You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data at any time. As a 'data controller', you may contact the University if you have questions about your data (details below).

We may also need to share it with third parties working on our behalf to support the processing of your transaction, or assist with our communications (e.g. mailing houses, printers). We will only do this in appropriate circumstances, for specified purposes, by secure means, using the minimum amount necessary, and with the relevant data sharing agreements in place. We do not and will not sell your data.

HOW LONG WE KEEP YOUR DATA

We will retain your financial data for seven years, even after you have ceased to be a member, in order to comply with tax and accounting rules. If you tell us you no longer wish to be a member, for example by cancelling your direct debit, we will retain your personal data for as long as is necessary to update our records. If you do not renew your

membership we will retain your personal data for one year after you cease to be a member. We will retain your name and the dates of your membership as part of the archive of the Friends of the Bodleian Libraries and our shared relationship management system.

YOUR RIGHTS

You have the right to opt-out of direct marketing at any time. You also have the rights to request access to and correction or erasure of your data; to request transfer of your data to another party; or to object to the processing of your data or request that such processing is restricted.
